Once again I would like to thank you for your generous donation of chair riser blocks you have been kind enough to give an abundant supply to the Arthritis Foundation. For more than 10 years the Woodworkers of Central Ohio have provided more than 500 sets of chair blocks. I hope you realize how much help these blocks provide to people with arthritis.

Clients who have used the blocks include an 87-year-old with osteoarthritis in her knees who was unable to get up from her couch without assistance from her son and a 50-year-old-man with deformities from cerebral palsy, recent total knee replacements and shoulder surgeries. His shoulders were not healing properly because of the pressure he had to use to get up. He was provided with blocks for his sofa and his bed. He called and thanked us for providing the blocks and stated that they make a great difference in his ability to get up. We would not be able to offer this service without you.

As you know, there are more than 860,000 central Ohioans with arthritis. We work every day to help improve their lives through leadership in the prevention, control and cure of arthritis and related diseases. With your support, we are able to make huge strides towards our mission.

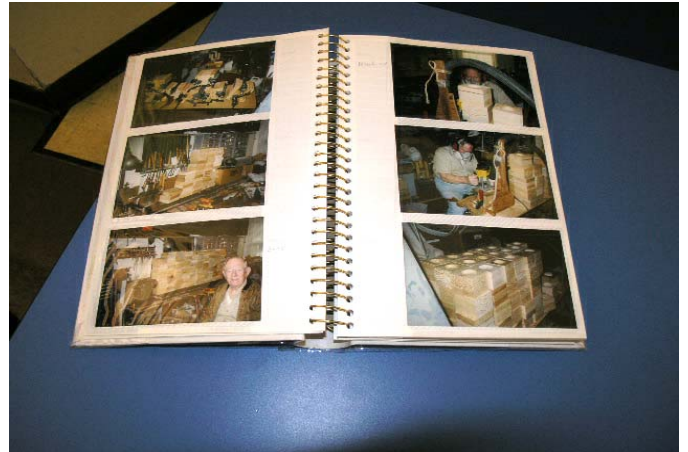

We were then given the opportunity to do hands on with different styles of bits and braces.
