members at large. The presidents would serve a term of three years with one leaving the group each year and a new president joining each year. The members at large might serve a term of 1 to 2 years.

The mission of the Board initially would be three fold:


- 1. Initiate getting the group the status of a 501 (3) (C) a nonprofit organization.
- 2. Seek grants and funding available for the group with the nonprofit status.
- 3. Use these grants and funding for obtaining a more permanent home for the group. This might take the form of a lease of a warehouse, store front or whatever the board might find available and suitable.

The nonprofit status would allow us to obtain tools, benches, and etc for the group's use and that of our presenters through grants and donations. These donations would generally be tax deductible. Also, it would provide a permanent place to store the library and other group assets, as well as provide a location

for group efforts for community service projects.

4. Developing a strategy to maintain this new facility.

This would take a change in our constitution and is not an endeavor to be taken lightly. I would like the membership to give this some serious thought and be prepared to offer comment on this subject in the next couple meetings. Assuming the group sees this as a positive direction to take the club we will create a more formal presentation for consideration and a vote.



At the February meeting, Chris Schwarz (Popular Woodworking) invited members of WOCO to a shop tour and presentation by Shepherd Tool Company.

The program began at 6 pm with ten-minute introduction and then it was time to eat. After supper a shop tour was in order. The shop was a bit smaller than I expected, but well equipped and laid out well. We saw a few projects that they are working on for future issues and some of their favorite jigs.



After the tour it was time for the presentation by Shepherd Tool Company. They make Norris and Spiers style planes in both finished and in kit form (at a considerable savings). These planes are made by dovetailing steel or steel and brass together to form the sides and sole. Then they in-filled them with cocobolo. The ease of assembly was demonstrated by having on person assemble a plane, while the other talked about the history of this style of plane and it's advantages and disadvantages. After that I was back to the shop to try out the finished products.



These planes excel at smoothing difficult hardwoods. The polish they leave on the wood is excellent. I was so impressed that I purchased a couple of kits myself and I plan to bring them to the June meeting which will be on hand planes. I'm also in the process of talking to Shepherd Tool Company about a club buy and will let everyone know if anything becomes of this. 
