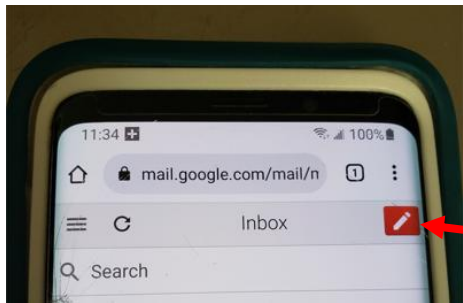


Using An Android Phone To Send Pictures

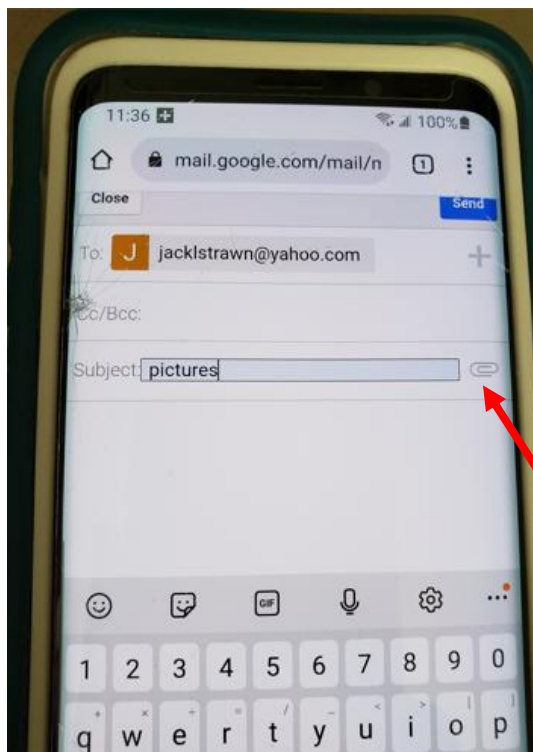
This example is Using Gmail email on your Smart Phone. Though you may use a different email service than Gmail and a different brand of cell phone, **look for similarities in words and symbols on your phone.**

These steps assume you have already taken the pictures using your cell phone that you wish to send.

Step #1. Enter your Gmail email account.



Step #2. Click the pencil to start a message.



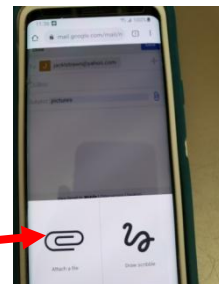
Step #3. To: type email address to whom will get pictures.

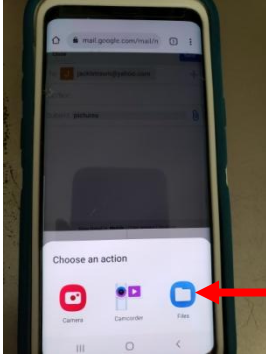
Step #4. Subject: [examples: picture(s) for newsletter, meeting, Member Showcase, photo ID].

Step #5. Click on paperclip symbol.

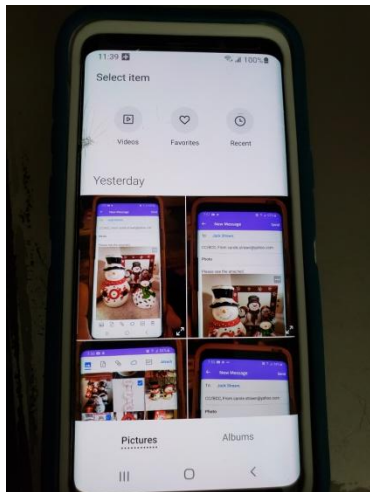

Step #6. Click on new paperclip symbol.





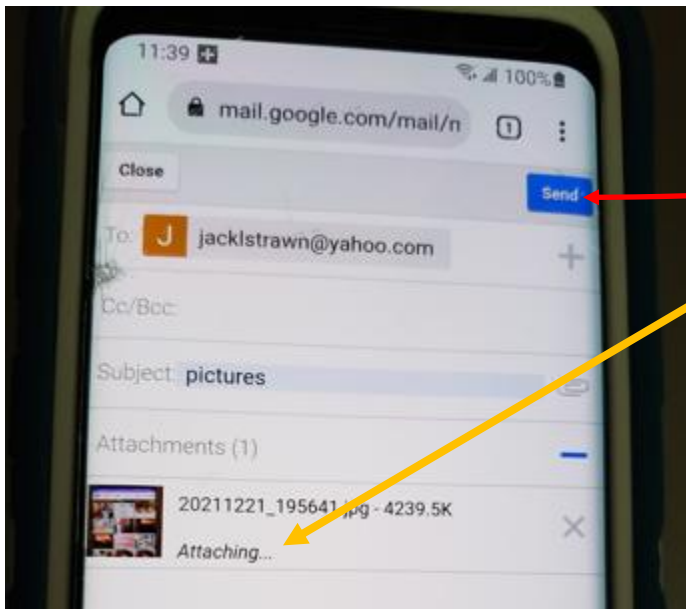
Step #7. Click on **Files** symbol.



Step #8. If needed, rub your finger side ways or up/down on the pictures to see more pictures. Tap on the **one picture** you wish to send.

If you wish to send more pictures, repeat steps #5-8 for each picture desired.

NOTE! There is a limit to the number of pictures you can attach to one email, usually 2 or 3. Of course, you can use additional email messages to send more pictures.



FINAL NOTE: **WAIT** until all of the words "**Attaching**" change to "**Attached**" then tap "**Send.**"
